## Knowing the Gospel, Articulating the Gospel and Sharing the Gospel

- 1. Why aren't Christian children sharing the gospel of Jesus with others?
  - a. Children do not know what Bible passages or theological words mean
  - b. Children do not know what the gospel of Jesus is
  - c. No one has specifically trained the children to know the gospel of Jesus from the scriptures
  - d. No one has trained the children how to conversationally share the gospel with others
- 2. Explain the Bible passages and theological words so the kids know the gospel and can articulate it in their own words
  - a. What does born-again mean?
  - b. Why do we need to be born again?
  - c. What is crucifixion?
  - d. What is sin and why am I a sinner?
  - e. Why did Jesus need to die for my sin?
  - f. What does resurrection mean?
  - g. What does it mean to "believe in" or "trust in" Jesus?
  - h. If Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection are so important why aren't we sharing it?
  - i. Now that I know what Jesus has done, how can I share the gospel with others?
- 3. Teach children why everyone needs Jesus:
  - a. Jesus loves everyone and wants to save them from sin (John 3:16)
  - b. Sin is anything we say, think, or do that breaks God's law and goes against God's heart
  - c. Everyone is a sinner in need of Jesus' forgiveness (Romans 3:23) (Romans 6:23)
  - d. Jesus' work is the only way to be forgiven from our sins and begin a relationship with God (John 14:6) (Acts 4:12)
- 4. Show the children where to find what Jesus has done for everyone
  - a. 1<sup>st</sup> Corinthians 15:3-5
  - b. John 3:16
- 5. Know the three parts of the gospel:
  - a. 1st Corinthians 15:3-4 clearly states the three parts to the gospel: Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection
  - b. Jesus died on the cross to pay for our sins (John 19:18 and 30)
  - c. Jesus was buried in a tomb for 3 days (Acts 2:31-32)
  - d. Jesus came back to life on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day to show He has power over sin and death (Acts 2:32)
- 6. Train children to share the work of Jesus from the scriptures and in their own words
  - a. Children need to be able to share Jesus anywhere and everywhere (2 Tim. 4:2)
  - b. I believe the church is not growing like it should because many Christians do not know the gospel nor how to share the gospel conversationally with others (Acts 8:35)
  - c. I believe that children can share the gospel with anyone, anywhere, anytime; if we train them (Matthew 28:19)
- 7. Five finger gospel
  - a. We all sin and our sin separates us from God (Romans 3:23)
  - b. Jesus loves you and died on a cross for your sins (John 3:16)
  - c. Jesus was dead for three days, then Jesus came back to life (1st Cor. 15:3-4)
  - d. Repent of your sins (1st John 1:9)
  - e. Believe in Jesus and Receive Jesus' gift of Salvation (Acts 16:31)
