

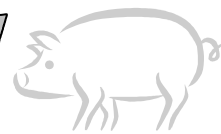

# The Prodigal Son



Luke 15:11-32

- When the Pharisees and scribes complained about the love Jesus had for sinners, He told them a parable to teach them that God loved them and would rejoice if they repented.
- The parable was about a rich man that had two sons and the younger son took his inheritance and went to a far off land. He spent all his money on worthless things.
- When a famine came into the land, the son began to starve. He decided to return to his father to work as a servant. When the father saw his son returning, he ran out of his house, hugged him, gave a great feast for him, and accepted him back as his son.
